

EXHIBIT A

AQUATICS FACILITY RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR LICENSEE

These rules have been established to protect the health, cleanliness and safety of our pools and patrons. It is the responsibility of the Licensee to ensure that all participants and their guests are aware of and adhere to these rules.

GENERAL RULES

1. All patrons must comply with the directions of the Lifeguards and Aquatics Staff. Failure to comply may result in suspension, or up to and including dismissal from the Facility and termination of the AGREEMENT.
2. All non-participants, including parents, are not permitted on deck unless prior permission has been granted by the Director or designee. Spectators must remain in the designated spectator area(s).
3. All patrons must change into and out of bathing suits in the designated dressing rooms only. Swimmers and guests may not change on the deck, park area, parking lots or front entrance.
4. Do not leave any personal belongings in the changing room. The CITY does not maintain a lost and found, and instructors are responsible for the belongings of their patrons.
5. CITY staff may be tested on emergency recognition and response time at any time that the Facility is open. In the event of an actual accident or simulated emergency drill, instructors and participants shall follow CITY staff's instructions. CITY staff is always in charge and responsible for all emergency situations.

FACILITY

1. No one is allowed in the Aquatics Facility unless the pool is officially open, and an Aquatics Facility staff member(s) is on duty. Swimmers shall not enter the pool deck area until an instructor and lifeguard are present. Swimmers and instructors are allowed in the Facility up to 15 minutes before and after their scheduled time allocation if Aquatics staff is available to supervise the Facility.
2. Food, beverages and gum/chew/seeds are not allowed in the Facility unless prior permission has been granted by the Director or designee. Water in plastic bottles is permitted.
3. It is the responsibility of the Licensee to remove and replace all equipment, kickboards, etc. All equipment should be put back before the end of the allocated time unless advised otherwise by the Aquatics Supervisor.
4. All equipment and users must be out of water and off the deck at the end of their allotted time. Licensee and their participants that are not out of the water, off the deck, and out of the Facility at the appropriate time will be charged additional guard fees in 30-minute increments. (See Exhibit B).
5. Report any broken or damaged equipment immediately to the Aquatics Supervisor or designee on duty immediately.
6. At no time will the maximum pool capacity be exceeded for lessons or special events. Persons or structures must not obstruct points of egress and emergency access at any time.

BEHAVIOR

1. Patrons must not engage in potentially destructive or dangerous behavior. Running, horseplay, dunking, profanity, pushing others into the pool, sitting or standing on kick boards will not be permitted and may result in disciplinary action. The Aquatics Supervisor shall bring such behavior to the attention of a LSA representative(s).
2. The Facility and equipment must be treated with due care and respect. Patrons may not sit, hang or play on any equipment, including but not limited to diving boards and lane lines. All patrons must swim under lane lines. Licensee and their patrons must not misuse or destroy any pool property.

HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICIES

1. Swimmers are not permitted in the water without both an LSA instructor and a lifeguard present.
2. Hypoxic training is dangerous and strictly forbidden at all CITY Facilities.
3. Diving into less than nine feet of water is inherently dangerous and poses risk of injury, dismemberment, or death. Instructors assume all liability for diving activities. Unless utilizing the starting blocks with the approval of the Aquatics Supervisor, all diving must occur in water that is at least nine feet deep. Swimmers and instructors that have not been properly trained may not utilize the starting blocks.
4. Swimmers must enter the pool feet first following the guidance in the section above.
